We've also got several wonderful messages of support from the biggest venues in the city, including from Brewery Wharf, the Merrion Centre and Leeds Markets.





AN EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH RADIO DJ STEPHANIE HIRST

With over 11 years hosting Capital FM's Breakfast Show 'Hirsty's Daily Dose'. Stephanie Hirst is one of the biggest radio stars in the country.

"I WAS WILLING TO LOSE

EVERYTHING

TO BE MYSELF"

After starting her career aged 12, she has had a hugely successful career, winning a grand total of 14 awards for her work in radio.

Stephanie Hirst also revealed that she was transgender in 2014. Since then, she has become a huge influential figure in the LGBT community, aiming to help other people in similar positions as her.

City Dweller Magazine met her to find out what she's up to now and to hear her thoughts on Leeds Pride 2017.

After originally making your name on Yorkshire's radio stations, including Capital FM and Radio Aire, where vou started vour career at the early age of 12, what are you up to now?

Oh I work at Burger King! *Laughs*.

Sorry, that was too easy! It's actually three years to the day that I finished at Capital FM and now, I do a weekly show on BBC Radio Manchester,

which is all vinvl. Even though I do love new music, I do love some of the older stuff. (Capital FM DJ) JoJo once said to me. "there's two types of music; good music and bad music" and it doesn't matter what genre it's from because if a song is good then it's good!

I literally play anything from the late 50s to the late 90s and everything is played live from vinyl. I have a collection of about 25,000 singles and albums so even if someone asks for a recommendation L can just go get the record and stick it on. It's the only show like it in the country.

Also, randomly I've started DJing in my kitchen on Facebook and it's gone nuts. I was doing a gig in Wakefield one weekend and I set my DJ stuff up beforehand to go through some new tunes. Anyways I started DJing and streaming it on Facebook Live and all of a sudden, there was 3000 people watching! I thought it was interesting so I've kept doing it... one week about 170,000 people were watching and I just went 'oh mv god'.

I'm also doing some national radio in the summer... but I can't talk about that yet! I also speak at schools, work with businesses and that sort of

stuff. A lot of businesses aet me to come in and talk to their staff as a motivational speaker.

You see I was at a point in my life where I was hosting the biggest breakfast show outside of London, along with the national chart show on a Sunday, this brought in lots of money, enough to buy an Aston Martin and all the fine trappings in life but it meant nothing. If you're not truly happy in yourself then what's the point in having any of that?

So I blew it all up. In my eyes, I was willing to lose everything to be myself.

Of course. So after going through gender reassignment treatment in 2014 you've been hugely involved in the promotion of LGBT rights. Can you tell us a bit about that?

I knew when I came out publicly that I had a responsibility, I had responsibility to show the public that trans people aren't freaks and weirdos. Basically, our brains form opposite to what we come out looking like, thus we grow up with a disparity between our mind and our body and that's all it is. I knew as early as 5 years old that I wasn't a boy! Explaining

that to the public is hugely satisfying, because it educates. When people have said to me that they don't get it, I just say 'you're not meant to get it'.

If you've got a chronic back pain then I've got no idea how that feels but I can empathise with it and I can accept it; it's all about acceptance. Every single one of us on this planet is born with the ability to accept things so why don't we just use it for the greater good? You're not meant to get it, you've just got to understand it.

In this issue of City Dweller Magazine, we're celebrating Leeds Pride 2017. Can vou tell us what Leeds Pride means to you?

It's huge! I'd seen London Pride and Manchester Pride grow over the the years but last year, I was on Leeds City Council's open top bus and to be there and to see people from all walks of life clapping, cheering and waving flags was wonderful. Leeds Pride is about living life with no filter and being your true, authentic self.

WE CAUGHT UP WITH EVERYONE'S FAVOURITE FLAMBOYANT TV PRESENTER OWAIN WYN EVANS TO FIND OUT ABOUT HIS CAREER AND WHAT LEEDS PRIDE MEANS TO HIM

Most of our readers will know you as the weather presenter for Look North in Leeds! Can you tell us a bit about your career before moving to Leeds?

I used to be a weather presenter and a journalist in Wales before becoming a weather producer in London but I've been working in Leeds for two years now, I'm moving up soon and I just absolutely love the city so I'm going to make it my home.

One of the great things about this job is that the weather effects everybody! Everyone wants to know what the weather is doing which means I get to be on TV and I get to really talk to my viewers and my listeners about my job, which is basically forecasting the weather!

If somebody wanted to follow in your footsteps, what advice would vou aive them?

It sounds so cheesy and really predictable but just be yourself! I have a flamboyant personality and I'm unapologetic about it: I feel that's really worked for me. In the past I've been told to be less camp but I just think you've got to be vourself.

I think a lot of people also think weathermen are given a script but that's not the case, you've got to analyse the forecasts and really understand them.

You're obviously a really busy guy, how do you switch off away from work?

One of things I love doing is playing the drums. I was a semi professional drummer for a time back in Wales, working as a session drummer and that was what I really wanted to do for a while. My parents probably hated it when I was growing up!

This issue of City Dweller Magazine is celebrating Leeds Pride. What does Leeds Pride mean to you. personally?

Pride events are something that have always been very important in my life. I came out when I was 18 and that was a long time ago now. things have changed a lot since I came out!

It's so important that people have a place where they can see that we're all in this together and where they can see that gay people are now accepted in society! Leeds is a great city for gay people too and I can't wait till Leeds Pride to celebrate this diversity.

A lot of people ask if we still need Leeds Pride events in 2017 because

we've moved forward so much as a society. But I think they're so important! Let's not forget the horrible things that are happening around the world to gay people and I think the Pride events are an opportunity for us to be grateful for what we have, to just enjoy our lives and be ourselves.

Obviously for this year's Leeds Pride weekend. we're all hoping for sunshine! Can you stick your neck out on the line and tell us what the weather will be like for the 5th and 6th August?

I wouldn't be able to! One thing I will say is that I'm going to be doing my sun-dance and praying to weather gods for dry weather.

BENGAL BRASSERIE

MODEL, EVENT PROMOTER AND CITY DWELLER MAGAZINE COLUMNIST ZACH WILLIAMSON VISITS THE MERRION CENTRE TO CHECK OUT LEEDS' NEWEST INDIAN RESTAURANT

A midweek treat meal in Leeds has always been a favourite tradition of mine. It's a great opportunity to catch up with family and friends whilst sampling some of the city's latest restaurant offerings. One of these restaurants is the new Bengal Brassiere, situated just outside the **Merrion Centre which is** quickly becoming the area to eat in Leeds Centre.

Over the past few years this area of Leeds has become host to some of the nicest international restaurants in the city including MyThai, Marco's New York Italian, Smoke BBQ & Bulgogi Grill, but Bengal Brasserie is the only one offering mouthwatering Indian cuisine. With the huge on site CitiPark car park (which is very affordable and leaves you with only the shortest of walks to the restaurant) it's perfectly located and is also in close proximity to the First Direct Arena.

As a little after work treat I invited my good friend Rachel along to join me for a beer and to try the à la carte menu and some of its newly added dishes. As we walked into the bar area the beautiful smell of Indian food filled the air and we were warmly greeted by the manager and seated on one of the large white leather sofas. I was firstly taken aback and impressed by the decor and colour scheme used, it was really light and contemporary.

A drinks order was taken in minutes and before we knew it, a beer and a large glass of white wine arrived to wash those midweek blues away. The menu is very impressive, not too much and not too little but the perfect mix of classic Indian favourites with Bengal Brassiere's own twist. As we were looking at the menu, a portion of popadoms arrived at the table complete with a pickle tray which was a nice touch. So far the staff had been excellent and couldn't do enough for us.

I have always been a lover of Indian cuisine so picking from the menu proved quite hard as everything sounded delicious but in the end we chose to share both our picks so we could get a varied taste of the menu. Personally this is how I think an Indian should be enjoyed; we had Lamb Chops and onion bhajis to start. The onion bhajis melted in the mouth, whilst the lamb chops were tender and perfectly cooked. For main we had an absolute feast, we chose Chicken Tikka on the Bone with Garlic Naan Bread and a Prawn Dopiaza with Keema Rice. For those not versed with Indian food, a Dopiaza is a mild to medium curry with a rich sauce and my personal favourite.

Bengal brassiere cooked it to perfection. Even though this was an intimate meal for two, the venue is also great for an after work meal and drinks as it has a varied drinks menu and is very family friendly with a relaxed vibe which makes it great for any

occasion or celebration. They also offer a lunchtime buffet from 12 till 2.30pm daily for just £8.85. As we were nearly bursting at the seams we skipped dessert even though I was tempted as they all sounded amazing.

After a short chat at our table with the manager, who really makes the effort to look after you, we left feeling full and in a great mood. We had a really great experience thanks to the authentic food, the service and the affordability which will keep us and many others coming back time and time again.

Thank you to all the staff, we will be back again very soon.

It's great for you to be here! As a city we're really proud of our own!

It's nice to be back in Leeds actually. Even though I've lived down south for the majority of my life, I moved down there when I was just a teenager at 19 but you don't forget your roots. Like, I never send red roses to girls - I've only ever sent white roses and I think every Yorkshire man should only

ever send white roses. We've got to bow to the house of


So does it mean a lot to you that you've opened Marco's New York Italian in Leeds?

It's nice to be back in Leeds and it's changed a bit but I used to come to the Merrion Centre, to a night club called 'The In Time' I used to go every Sunday. It was weird but it seemed perfectly

normal to me because I used to have Sunday and Monday off when I worked at The Boxtree.

Leeds has changed so much and the one way system makes it all rather complicated! Even though Leeds has changed, Boar Lane is the same, Leeds Markets is the same, the Town Hall is the same and I have a lot of affection for Leeds and my mother always used to say 'a tree without roots is just a piece of wood' so I think you've got to be loyal and it doesn't matter what you do in the end. Pigeons always come home to roost in the end.

I've been a bit of a gypsy all my life but I love going back to Harewood. That was my playground as a child you see, so that's my favourite place on earth, in the gardens of Harewood.





Along the wharf front down to Woodhall Bridge because that's where I used to fish as a child. I come from humble beginnings, I must've been born on the last council estate in Leeds at the time because I just used to walk up the street, across the golf course and I was on the Harewood estate. So how lucky was I?! Rather than growing up in a city.

What advice would you give to someone who wants to follow in your footsteps?

Well I would never recommend anyone to go in my footsteps, but what I would recommend to any young person who wants to go into my industry, and I look back at the early beginnings, and I would recommend for any young person to put their career in the right hands. If you put your career in the wrong hands at the start, the chances are that realising a dream are very slim.

I was very lucky, I started at a three star hotel in Harrogate called The Hotel St. George and did I learn much about food? No I didn't but did I learn how to be fast? Did I learn how to run? Did I learn how to use a knife like never before? Because that Hotel was so so busy, and in those days everything was fresh.

But when I say busy, if I was doing pomme chateau, where you turn potatoes, you're doing them for 200 people and not for 5 like in a restaurant.

I actually used to polish the clients shoes in the afternoon round the back of the lodge and one day, on the table, there was a small book and on the cover it said 'The Egon Ronay Guide to Hotels and Restaurants in Great Britain' so I started flicking through it, and I noticed two things.

Firstly, that restaurants had stars. I didn't know that restaurants had stars! So I started reading up about it and there was two restaurants in Harrogate. there was Olivers and Number 6 who both had a star rating but then what I noticed was that the best restaurant in Britain, according to Egon Ronay who was the most powerful critic at the time, was just 15 miles down the road at The Boxtree and I went back into the kitchen that night and I thought to myself 'maybe if I want to be a chef maybe I should work at the best restaurant in Britain'. It took me about six months to pluck up the courage to apply for a job.

I always say in life, that success is born out of luck. Luck is being given the opportunity and it's the awareness of mind that takes advantage.

It's like, how did I get my job in Le Gavroche? I wrote to two restaurants, I wrote to Gavroche and I wrote to a place in The New Forest called Chewton Glen. Gavroche sent me an application back in French, I tried to fill it out, I couldn't read it and made a mess of it, so I was too embarrassed to send it back. Chewton Glen however invited me for an interview so I got the coach from Leeds to London Victoria and then from London Victoria to Dorset. They offered me a job in the pastry but I'm not interested in desserts, so I said I'd think about it.

I got on the coach to come home and when I arrived in the station from Dorset it was rather dark and I was rather lost, I wasn't used to city life! So I asked this Royal Mail man 'how do you get to Victoria Station?' He said 'I'm going there! Jump in' so I jumped in with him, he took me to Victoria coach station and I'd missed my last coach home. The next coach is in the morning at 8/9 o'clock so I thought to pass the time I'll just walk the streets. I set off out of the back of Victoria Coach Station, walked up the

road and thought, if I turn right, turn right, turn right, I'll walk in a circle - there's some kind of logic in there.

So I walk up this road, turn right and I'm walking up that road and I find myself looking through the window of a restaurant. I can see that it's posh and the name above the door was 'Le Gavroche' That was the restaurant that I'd written to for a job, so I thought 'before I get my coach in the mooring I'll knock on the door and ask if they have any vacancies'. And that's how I got my job at Le Gavroche!

And that's why I say success is born out of luck. Luck is being given the opportunity and it's awareness of mind that takes the opportunity.





Arranging insurance for married couples should arguably go hand in hand with saying "I do".

Financial matters are perhaps not the first consideration when getting married. But it is vitally important to review current financial arrangements and establish new plans at the start of a significant new stage of life.

Perhaps the first and most obvious thing to consider is wedding insurance, given that even a simple ceremony and reception will cost many thousands of pounds - £25,090 on average, according to a recent survey. (www.hitched.co.uk, accessed 30 May 2017) But once the honeymoon is over, the serious thinking needs to start, and this is the point at which couples will need financial

At the simplest level, a couple might want to maximise their ISA allowance and other taxefficient investments, perhaps by moving some assets from one spouse to the other, thus taking advantage of the fact that transfers to a spouse are exempt from Capital Gains Tax. They may also want to think about their pension beneficiaries, dividend income and property ownership: and they will of course want to update their Wills.

But there is another reason why marriage is a financial marker: it is a time when people first start sharing their lives - and their debt - with someone else. Consequently, it is an opportune moment to put some protection in place.

Life insurance should be a highpriority consideration, as it can provide the security that money is available to meet mortgage and other financial commitments should one partner die. Similarly, a 'joint-life second death' wholeof-life policy could help settle Inheritance Tax liabilities when both individuals have passed away.

Life cover should be put in place even by those who do not consider themselves to be wealthy - and it is relatively straightforward to arrange. However, not everyone will be able to secure cover through the standard market.

"Increasingly, people are getting married when they are older or indeed getting married for a second or third time," says Torquil McLusky, managing director at Pulse Insurance, a specialist insurer.

Till death us do part?

We all hope that marriage will last forever, but the fact is that more than 40% of marriages now end in divorce (Office for National Statistics, November 2015). Inevitably, financial plans made as a married couple may not survive a divorce - especially if they no longer make financial

"Unfortunately, divorce is not something that we can insure against," says McLusky. "The best we can probably do is a prenuptial agreement, which, although not yet recognised in statute, the UK courts will at least take into consideration when making a settlement."

Many couples will have joint life insurance policies in place, and often the premium is paid by just one of the parties. If that spouse stops paying or cancels the policy, then the other partner could be left without life insurance. Sadly, lots of breakups become bitter or lengthy because couples can't agree how to split the finances or continue paying insurance premiums. In those cases, individuals will need some professional financial and legal advice.

"The bottom line is that divorce means thinking again as far as financial planning is concerned," adds McLusky.

UP TO DATE?

Louise Burgess, from Levi Solicitors LLP, presents her legal column in City Dweller Magazine.

If you are a landlord of a residential property, it is important that you are up to date with the energy performance requirements.

From 1 April 2018, all properties being let out must have a minimum energy performance rating of E on an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC). Non-compliance could lead to a fine, so it is important that you are ready for the changes.

What properties will this apply to?

The requirements will apply to residential private rented properties in England and Wales. It will apply to Assured Shorthold Tenancies (ASTs), as well as other types of tenancy agreements.

Some types of property are excluded from the regulations. These include some temporary buildings: those intended to be used for less than four months of the year and buildings that are particularly small. Listed buildings and similar may also be excluded to a degree.

What if it is below an E rating?

Landlords will be prohibited from letting out a property with an EPC with an F or G rating. You must carry out energy efficiency improvements to bring the property up to at least an E ratina.

Are there any exemptions?

The regulations only require that landlords make appropriate, permissible and cost-effective improvements. Landlords may be eligible for an exemption from offence. reaching the minimum standard, but must provide evidence that they qualify. Some of the exemptions are that:

- The landlord has carried out cost-effective improvements, but the rating remains below an E.
- The landlord requires consent to do the works, but the occupying tenant or freeholder withholds that consent.
- A qualified, independent surveyor has confirmed that carrying out the improvements would cause the property value

to decrease by over 5%. Any measures expected to cause such decrease would be exempt.

You must record all exemptions in a national register. If you do not register the exemption, it will not be effective and you will not have complied with the regulations. The register is planned to open on 1 October

When will this start?

The regulations will apply from 1 April 2018 when you grant:

- · A new tenancy to a new tenant;
- Or a new tenancy to an existing tenant. This includes extensions or renewals to existing tenants, including statutory periodic tenancies that come into existence at the end of fixed term ASTs.

From 1 April 2020, the regulations will apply to all privately rented property (except where excluded from the regulations). This includes those let out on tenancies that started before 1 April 2018.

Where a local authority suspects that a landlord has not complied or has not obtained an exemption, they can serve a compliance notice. They will request further information that they consider necessary to confirm compliance. If the information is not provided. or is not enough to confirm compliance, a local authority may issue a penalty notice. Individual penalties are up to £4,000, depending on the

Next steps

Landlords have less than a year to make any necessary impovements to their rental properties. If you have a lease coming to an end or are looking at renewing a tenancy, it is advisable to act now. Failure to do so could leave you unable to re-let your property, or liable for substantial fines.

YOU NEVER GET A SECOND CHANCE TO MAKE A FIRST IMPRESSION

INTERIOR DESIGNER, PROPERTY GURU AND CITY DWELLER MAGAZINE COLUMNIST CHRISTINE YORATH TELLS US HOW IMPORTANT COMMUNAL AREAS ARE TO APARTMENT BUILDINGS



How fabulous to see more new apartment schemes starting up in Leeds, I just hope that the developers will be paying attention to the communal areas which are so important and yet can be overlooked in the development stage.

When I owned the management company 'Flats in Leeds', I saw the interiors of most of the city centre apartment buildings and they varied enormously in appearance

and maintenance. The best sales values and the best rents are achieved where the apartment entrance halls are immaculate, well designed and welcoming.

Over 15 years ago I built 18 luxury apartments at 19 Wellington Street and installed expensive and beautiful light fittings and a bespoke carpet to all the hallways with the grand staircase having a bordered carpet and although I would probably select differently today I am pleased to say the quality is still apparent and the elegance of the building remains unlike so many apartment buildings which have communals looking like a cross between a hospital and an office block.

I was also careful not to sacrifice space and convert so much of the floor space to saleable square footage that the access to each apartment would have only been served by a corridor.

The buildings with good management and a concierge service usually have a higher quality of appearance but even then can be sterile and impersonal. One of the best examples I have seen locally in recent times is the entrance to The Residence apartments in York where the ground floor hallway is akin to a 5 star hotel lounge.

Conversely, a couple of years ago I broke my ribs on a broken staircase handrail in a small Leeds development on Central Road where the maintenance was so neglected it was dangerous, the same building usually had mountains of post in the doorway due to the lack of a proper postal system for rentals.

It is such a waste when developers overlook the obvious and miss out on such an opportunity. I did the interiors including all the communals for Biba House in York a couple of years ago and it is no coincidence that we achieved higher prices per square foot in sales and higher rentals than had been achieved generally in York city centre before that time.

I hope in the future the discerning buyers and tenants will become more demanding about their expectations for the communal areas of apartment buildings and not only their personal interiors.

MEET ANDREW COOPER FROM LEEDSBID

WE MET UP WITH THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OF LEEDSBID TO FIND OUT ABOUT THEIR WORK IN THE CITY CENTRE. HIS BACKGROUND IN BUSINESS AND TO FIND OUT WHAT HE LOVES THE MOST ABOUT LEEDS

Hi Andrew, can you tell us about LeedsBID and your role there?

In 2015 the business community of Leeds in conjunction with other organisations had the aspiration and ambition to create the largest Business Improvement District outside of London which I am proud to lead. The BID is funded by 1,000 businesses and organisations to create tangible, visible 'improvements' to the city centre, investing £2.5m a year in Leeds.

LeedsBID is a catalyst for change, providing the alue which brings people, businesses and sectors together to make new things happen. It has already been the driving force behind a number of bold and innovative projects in the city centre from the Welcome Ambassadors and Street Rangers to the Leeds International Festival and A City Less Grey - our work to transform the city continues at pace.

The strength of a Business Improvement District is that it is not-for-profit, business-led and aims to engage with every sector of the community to enhance and amplify all that is great

about our city. I believe no one organisation can achieve this in isolation therefore the ethos of the BID is to work collaboratively so that everyone benefits.

What actually is your background in business?

At 17 I started my working life for the grocery retailer Presto, which went on to be absorbed by the Safeway Group. Then for nearly 14 years I continued my career in retail at Boots The Chemists, specialising in retail logistics.

With a degree in Business. I made a move into 'Place Management' as Town Manager of Stratford-upon-Avon and developed the Business Improvement District 'Stratforward' before going on to Bath to do the same in the World Heritage City.

Since working in Leeds, I am actively involved in the Northern BIDs Group as BIDs become a more recognised and sustainable vehicle for change across the North.

If someone was wanting to follow in your footsteps, what advice would you give to them?

We spend a third of our life at work, so do something you enjoy. If someone specifically wants to work in 'Place Management', the good news is that people in these roles come from a variety of professional backgrounds; retail, banking, engineering and marketing, to name but a few.

Now recognised as an industry, 'Place Management' has a number of professional bodies such as the Institute of Placement Management and The Association of Town and City Management to support professional roles in this field.

This issue of our magazine is a Leeds Pride special. Can you tell us what you think Leeds Pride brings to the city?

Leeds Pride Director Liagat Ali and those involved in Pride bring a great energy and vibrancy to the city during the weekend of 5th-6th August. Unlike similar events in other UK cities, Leeds Pride is a free event and we have been working closely to support this event, through the Welcome Ambassadors and our marketing team.

The event brings people from across the UK to the city who then get to see the transformation which is taking place. Events are essential in shaping a place and putting

EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW WITH FOOTBALLER ROBBIE ROGERS

AFTER LEAVING LEEDS UNITED IN 2013. ROBBIE ROGERS MADE HEADLINES AROUND THE WORLD WHEN HE CAME OUT AS GAY. CITY DWELLER MAGAZINE MET UP WITH ROBBIE ROGERS TO SPEAK ABOUT THAT BRAVE DECISION, HIS TIME IN LEEDS AND WHAT PRIDE MEANS TO HIM

On May 26 2013, Robbie Rogers became the first openly gay man to compete in a top North American sports league.

Prior to that, he'd played everywhere from Colombus, Ohio to Leeds United while picking up 18 caps for the United States in the process.

Now, as an inspiration for people around the world, Robbie Rogers is playing for LA Galaxy. We met up with him to talk about his career so far and what it's really like to be an openly gay footballer.

Can you tell us about your time at Leeds United and what it was like living in Leeds?

I loved living in Leeds.

Growing up in LA, I usually only heard about London, but I loved Leeds and thought the people were very friendly and passionate about their city. The club was great with me. I found it tough that I came when there were so many changes with the managers and the club but I still have very fond memories of my short time at the club.

Shortly after you left the club you made headlines around the world when you came out as gay. What inspired you to make that decision, at that moment in time, and how did you find the initial reaction?

I had accomplished almost everything I wanted to in my career and I was still very unfulfilled and depressed. I

decided that the only way to really free myself (I know, sounds cheesy!) was to be open about something that was crushing me for 25 years.

Since leaving Leeds United, you made the decision to retire from football before coming back to play for LA Galaxy. What inspired your decision to return to football and how are you finding life at LA Galaxy?

I was speaking in Portland to around 500 kids that are leaders for their LGBTQ clubs (Gay-Straight Alliances) and after I spoke to them, I realised each one of them would take the opportunity I had to play and make a difference for millions of gay men and

women and that I would be a coward if I chose not to go back to football.

This issue of City Dweller Magazine is a Leeds Pride special. What do Pride events like these mean to you personally and why do you think they are important?

I enjoy Pride for a few reasons. I feel like it's a day or month where we can celebrate our accomplishments as a community but also remain vigilant and vocal about our future obstacles in finding equality for our whole community.

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HAVE YOUR CAKE AND EAT IT TOO?

CITY DWELLER MAGAZINE HAVE TEAMED UP WITH JAMES AND JOE FROM SUSTAIN NUTRITION AND THIS MONTH WE'RE FINDING OUT IF WE CAN HAVE OUR CAKE AND EAT IT TOO

Can you really have your cake and eat it too?

Well yes and no?!

Our staple answer for most nutrition answers as always is 'it depends', as frustrating as I'm sure this sounds it's simply because we don't want to lie to you.

Nutrition is never black and white I'm afraid, there are lots of different shades of grey in the food spectrum.

Often times as coaches we get asked is this OK to eat, say it's an all-natural ingredient but high fat chicken curry for example.

Now as the ingredients are all from natural foods just like mamma used to make then I'm all for the JERF (just eat real food) approach but ultimately fat loss will come down to overall calories consumed, if this high calorie curry that pushes you over that calorie limit then technically it wasn't OK to eat.

Same thing will apply to club biscuits, wine, beer and crisps.

Can you eat these foods and still drop fat, technically yes, so long as you are still in a calorie deficit.

This can be the appeal for people who track MACROS (macronutrients).

They can set a target of calories, protein, carbs and fats and fit their foods in to these targets, this approach can be valuable particularly when a clean eating approach has stalled, after all if you are already clean eating you cannot simply 'eat cleaner'.

The downside of this will be when people use this approach to shoe horn less than optimal food choices like chocolate and cake in.

This approach will presume

that the carbs from a slice of chocolate cake are equal to the carbs you would get from sweet potato, doesn't sound right to me does it.

Not just the hormonal and physical affects will be totally different but it's almost like spending your money on magic beans!

We all know the story of Jack and the Beanstalk?

Eating poor quality foods to hit MACROS is a similar idea, say you have 2000cal to 'spend' on food, personally I don't want to waste 400cal on a piece of cake when I can eat a large chicken breast and some greens for that. One is a moment on the lips, life time on the hips and the other is a filling meal that will take me closer to my goals.

Blowing your calories allowance on poor choice foods is not going to be great from a health or good habit-forming view.

So, whilst you may be able to get away with eating some less than ideal foods for a while this unfortunately won't always

There will be a point where you have to drop something to reduce calories, you will have to make the choices of the easy fix of dropping the club biscuit or reducing the healthy nutritious foods, it's a no brainer for me.

This month I've interviewed Rupi Purewal, to hear her inspirational and very motivational story to discover how she uses her own personal experience to help and encourage others...

Rupi: I will always remember the first time I found water THE most refreshing drink ever. 7 years ago, I was at the back of a combat class, wheezing at the 1st minute of the warm up! I was 4 stone heavier, 4 dress sizes bigger and wondered how on earth I was going to keep it up! Looking at me now, many assume I was athletic at school with a sporty back ground, nothing could be further from the truth.

I was overweight and always picked last for sports. I hated PE at school and never took to the gym until the age of 21. I remember sports day at high school when I got lumbered with

the 800 metre run. I was so slow as I reached 500m, they decided to start the boys 800 metre run behind me! But one thing I did not do was give up. I made it round with people cheering me on, and won 3 points for my form. Those points meant that we won the gold cup! That pretty much sums up my life, no matter how hard or long the struggle, I will always finish.

By the age of 24 I had lived enough to know that I needed to follow my own path in life, even if this meant going against traditions and customs. As cliché as it sounds I decided to follow my heart. As much as I knew I was doing the right thing for myself it was a huge battle to convince others close to me. This led me into a 3 year depression which saw me give up on life and so very nearly myself. One valuable lesson I have learned: We may think that following your heart and I suppose even your soul's calling is all happiness and light, it isn't! It's hard work and needs a consistent positive mental attitude and no one to take you off your focus.

I always remember the day my mum sat me down and suggested I should seek help. This was my wake up call. I begged my mum for 4 weeks to sort myself out. At the time I had been paying gym membership for over a year and only attended twice! After all the self-help books I had read and

articles to improve myself my journey to fitness began.

So I found myself in the gym, it was a Tuesday evening, 19.15 and I was attending my first Body Combat class. I was huffing and puffing my way through it, drinking gallons of water and very un-coordinated! But I kept going as this was not about the present uncomfortable feeling, this was for my health, my body and was something I was doing for me. The euphoric high, the energy in the room, the empowerment from doing the moves saw me going in every night. Attending different classes such as Body Attack, Body Pump and Step.

I was feeling happier, my mind wasn't on overdrive, it was like for one hour I was present with. no cares or worries, just me, the moves and the music! Surrounding myself with others who had this amazing 'can do' energy, everyone striving to finish a session to the end was amazing. Instructors who were motivating, encouraging and on some occasions even performing! Suddenly problems did not feel like problems anymore! I was losing weight, I was eating better too so I could sustain my new hobby. Heels were being replaced with trainers. I was addicted and finally I decided to make a career change into fitness. Through home learning courses I passed my group exercise course with

flying colours and 4 months later was employed as a group exercise manager. The rest is history...

My passion for group exercise is very personal for me and why I can get through on average 17 classes a week. It's not just about fitness or looking better, it's about feeling better with yourself. Everyone that comes into my studio will have problems and issues and life to deal with. It is my responsibility to make people forget their worries, push past their makebelieve boundaries and reach a better version of themselves. The energy of those people in one room, putting everything into their workout and encouraging others to keep going, when they feel like they just can't do anymore, is infectious.

We have over 60 classes available each week at the club and all are free to members as part of your membership. So why not follow Rupi's amazing example, come down to the club and try a class and it could very well change your life too!

When you first set up SpeedQueen, what was the aim behind it?

We wanted to set up a night for everybody! For gay people, for cross dressers, for girls on their own; we just wanted a mixed club. We really did try to get everyone together. We had two sixtieth birthday parties one night, and we had 5 wheelchairs in there on another! We used to make sure girls on their own could get straight in and we've never done VIP because we don't believe in it, everybody has to stick together at SpeedQueen.

It was set up in the 90s and I think a lot of people look at that as quite a golden time for going out in Leeds, don't they?

Oh, it was fantastic! Every nightclub for gay people used to be underground... so as soon as the dance scene started, everyone mixed together. Everybody just danced together and it was a really special time.

A lot of couples met each other and there's been a few children born because of SpeedQueen! We do parties now and we get three generations of people going.

Do you recognise the cultural effect that SpeedQueen has had on Leeds? Do you think the fact you're still throwing parties now shows it's lasted the test of time?

I don't recognise it but obviously I was in the thick of it. I just set it up for people who were working Monday to Friday and wanted to have a good time on the weekend. People do still say to me how amazing it was for them.

We made sure we had everyone involved too, from the dancers to the people that created the decor. Everybody got a piece of the cake! We had a little family going on there. We also nurtured a lot of girl DJs including Alice Bailey, Ms. Melodie, Lucy Locket, Gina Breeze and Adele Roberts.

I think it's lasted the test of time because it's so community based. Some club nights are all about the music and the DJs but for us, it was about everyone and we made sure it had this village feel. I don't know if any other club night has ever had that in Leeds. I'd say 75% of my friends are people I've met through SpeedQueen.

A lot of people associate SpeedQueen with the iconic SpeedQueen image (pictured). Can you tell us about the meaning behind

We went on a trip to India and we saw pictures of this woman everywhere. We just loved her. When we got back, we decided to take her on board and use it, so when we got back we drew her and used her on everything we did for SpeedQueen.

She just says everything about SpeedQueen, she is saying 'welcome' and encouraging you to come in and have a good time.

You're taking over Bar Fibre and Queens Court on the 5th August for Leeds Pride, Can you tell us a bit about that?

We were asked to do it last year as part of Leeds Pride's 10th anniversary celebrations. It was really cool to be asked but we were a bit worried about it! Anyways we did it and everyone loved it, so we've been asked again this year. It's really nice to be involved in Leeds Pride.

Personally, what does Leeds Pride mean to vou?

It's so good for everybody to come down, get together and celebrate. It's not about being gay, it's about celebrating gay pride and appreciating that we can do this party in the centre of Leeds without any hassle. I just think it's amazing.

Unspoilt by high-rise hotels, accommodation tends to be in guest houses and B&B's, although there are some larger resorts for those looking for more onsite facilities. Mykonos would make a lovely place for a honeymoon, especially if choosing a boutique hotel.

Slightly closer to home, Sitges in Spain, is a stone's throw


from Barcelona and now considered one of the "Big 4" gay destinations. It has popular Gav Pride events and many of its bars and clubs are rocking all year round, although the season really takes off from Easter onwards. Carnival, Pride, Bears Week and Fiesta Major are all excuses for parties, not to be missed!

Further afield, New York City is a vibrant melting pot of cultures that coalesce in an atmosphere of tolerance and acceptance. The city's queer credentials are well established and neighbourhoods like the West Village, Chelsea and Hell's Kitchen offer a huge choice of gay-friendly accommodation, plus all the nightlife you'd expect of 'The City That Never Sleeps'!

With a similarly cosmopolitan and Bohemian feel, Berlin needs little introduction as the home of hedonism, with a gay history dating back almost 100 years. The annual Gay Pride event is the jewel in its crown but there's a year round choice of bars, clubs and restaurants that same sex couples will feel happy and relaxed in.

I've only just touched the surface with these destinations but can also recommend Skiathos, Palm Springs, San Francisco, Reykjavik, Toronto and even far-flung New Zealand, as great places to holiday or even tie the knot! MEET THE LEEDS BASED BROTHERS ON A MISSION TO MAKE REGGAE AVAILABLE TO ALL

WE CAUGHT UP WITH CONRAD AND MICHAEL CRUISE TO FIND OUT ABOUT HOW THEY'RE BRINGING THEIR MUSIC TO THE PEOPLE OF LEEDS

Leeds based music producers, label owners and band colleagues Conrad and Michael Cruise have released 'Wisdom of Roots,' a collection of sounds combining modern music making expertise to create a varied album of music with Jamaican popular music at its core.

Working under the band name DX1, Conrad and Michael have taken some material they originally wrote some years ago and combined it with newly penned material to produce 'Wisdom of Roots'. Both brothers wrote all the material and provide the musical backing between them in taking care of percussion, guitar, and state of the art keyboards.

They've enlisted the help of two seasoned local vocalists Rickey Smith and Clifford Hughes who, between them, imbue the sung material with different feels and moods appropriate to the tracks they appear on. As Conrad explains: "our aim here is to make Jamaican music accessible to all and to show the breadth of styles and emotions this great musical form provides."

'Wisdom of Roots' covers a varied range of subject matter from earnest love songs to moody and edgy city instrumental soundscapes through to more upbeat 'party style' flavoured sounds, sometimes through adroit re-workings of a similar

musical refrain that's appeared elsewhere on the collection, to create different moods and emotions.

The album is designed to be enjoyed by those already fans of the reggae and roots sound along with those exploring and sampling this type of music for perhaps the first time.

The brothers' desire to extend Jamaican music's appeal is not surprising as they both work tirelessly to achieve this through their production and music making endeavours with their label, Cruise International. They champion music from both exciting newcomers and artists who recorded many years ago; they believe in giving a chance for hitherto older music to 'live on' through being released on their label.


As Conrad further comments: "so many people would enjoy music that they may not ever get the chance to listen to, so we're doing our bit to put people in touch with music they'll like and may even become passionate about."

To achieve this, along with the release of 'Wisdom of Roots' showing that reggae based music can be accessible and its roots and characteristics shine through even while being made with modern music making technology, the Cruise International website is designed to be easy to navigate and download music from. Working as music creators through their work with DX1, and pursuing their roles as producers and providers through running a label, puts Conrad and Michael in the position of seeing music creation from both a music maker and a publisher's perspective, so giving them a unique take on the situation: "we can empathise with the artists we work with and they know they're dealing

with people who have been, and still are, in their position" said Conrad.


